The society is focused on community engagement, charitable work, and education.




Our Mission

Membership Requirements

Membership is open to anyone who meets one of the following requirements:

- An individual employed by a law enforcement agency and appointed as a peace officer, as defined by the Criminal Code of Canada.
- An individual who is employed by a law enforcement agency, who is not a sworn peace officer.
- An individual who served a minimum of 10 years and retired in good standing from a law enforcement agency. Or, an individual who as a result of injury or illness, retired from a law enforcement agency.




